# **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

## **EMERGENCY DRILLS: DON'T DRILL TO A DRILL - PRACTICE TO AN EMERGENCY!**

WA State Legislature requires monthly drills (including any month when students are in your buildings - to include Summer School). These drills focus on:

- Lockdown Secure the Building (lockout)
- Evacuations Fire, hazardous releases within your building, etc.
- Shelter-in-Place
- Earthquake: "Drop, Cover, and Hold" a new requirement from the 2019 legislative session
  - Great ShakeOut, an international event, is scheduled for October 17, 2019 @ 10:17 a.m.
    - Do you evacuate your building(s) after an earthquake?
- Reunification Plan: Legislature now requires districts to have this plan.

#### **BE PREPARED AND PRACTICE!**

Are *you* prepared for an emergency within your building? Things to consider <u>before</u> an emergency event include:

- Your location to an exit(s) what if your closest exit is blocked by fire, debris, or the door is jammed from structural damage? Where do you go next?
- Where is the closest Fire Alarm Pull-Station we see them every day but can we recall where they are during the pressure of an emergency?
- Where is your closest First-Aid kit and AED? Do you have a plan to take them outside during an evacuation?
- Does your plan address who is responsible for retrieving emergency medications when evacuating the building?
- Where is your closest fire extinguisher? Remember PASS... Pull, Aim, Squeeze, and Sweep.
- Can you easily and quickly secure your work area (classroom, office, etc.)?
- If assigned to work in a portable classroom: Can you easily and quickly turn off the heating or air-conditioning ventilation system if the outside air is contaminated?

• Do you know where your Emergency Plan is located? (It may be an emergency flipchart). Remember to PRACTICE and take drills seriously! When an emergency occurs you react in the same fashion as you have practiced previously.

### BOMB THREATS

Consider keeping a checklist cards under your phone so it's readily available to provide guidance during a stressful call situation. Here is a link to an example:
