Here are some suggestions from staff in NCW schools on how to stay safe at work this year:

- Use step ladders or stools when getting to things higher than my reach instead of using a chair.
- Make sure all tripping hazards are picked up in my room and chairs are pushed in to keep myself and students as safe as possible.
- Keep cords covered.
- Wipe up spills immediately.
- Wear the right kind of shoes for the weather/conditions...especially in the winter!
- Wear my YakTrax in snow and ice.
- Use, and teach my students to use, the handrail on the ramp, especially in wet/snowy weather.
- Discuss potential emergency situations with students and how to handle them calmly and effectively.
- Make sure the safety vest I wear as a crossing guard is highly visible and not faded.
- Make sure the safety guards are on paper cutters.
- > Walk around the building to familiarize myself with all the important exits and safety features.
- Make sure all exits are clear of any objects that could interfere with safe exit.
- Be alert and aware of my surroundings.
