Pertussis 2017

Total Cases: 82

Moses Lake: 56 cases, last case 11/15/17

Ephrata: 22 cases, last case 10/5/2017

Soap Lake: 2 cases, last case 9/12/2017

Royal City: 1 case, last case 8/14/2017

Warden: 1 case, last case 7/9/2017

Median age: 11 years old

1 infant hospitalized with good outcome

Unvaccinated rate for all cases: 26%

Age range: 4 months old – 75 years old.





Mumps 2017 New Guidelines

Exclusion

Schools:

In the setting of a mumps outbreak in a school, if pupils who are exempted from immunization for any reason are excluded, the exclusion period should be through 25 days after the last known exposure. Excluded susceptible students who choose to be vaccinated can be readmitted immediately after immunization.

CDC now recommends 3rd MMR vaccine during an outbreak

The CDC now recommends a third dose of a mumps virus-containing vaccine for people who've previously received two doses but are at increased risk because of an outbreak. The recommendation, proposed in October by the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, has been published in *MMWR*.

People considered at high risk during an outbreak include those who "are more likely to have prolonged or intense exposure to droplets or saliva from a person infected with mumps, such as through close contact or sharing of drinks or utensils." Those at increased risk who've previously received fewer than two doses of mumps-containing vaccine — or don't know their vaccination status — should also receive one dose.

Among the reasons for the recommendation: mumps cases in 2016 and 2017 were the highest they've been in a decade, and epidemiologic data show that a third vaccine dose reduces attacks during outbreaks.

Influenza Season 2017-2018

- "Flu season is here" declared 12/15/17, 3 weeks earlier than last year
- Earlier reports of hospitalizations and deaths state wide
- 46 deaths statewide, no pediatric deaths
- * H3N2 and H1N1 identified in WA, which is a component of the current vaccine




Grant County Flu

- Flu A- 234 reported cases
- Flu B- 124 reported cases
- Flu A&B- 5 reported cases
- > 50% of cases are < 18 years old</p>
- 1 lab-confirmed influenza death
- 2 Long Term Care outbreaks

- GCHD planning outreach to public areas with resource list/bar codes/ect...






Opioid Crisis
