



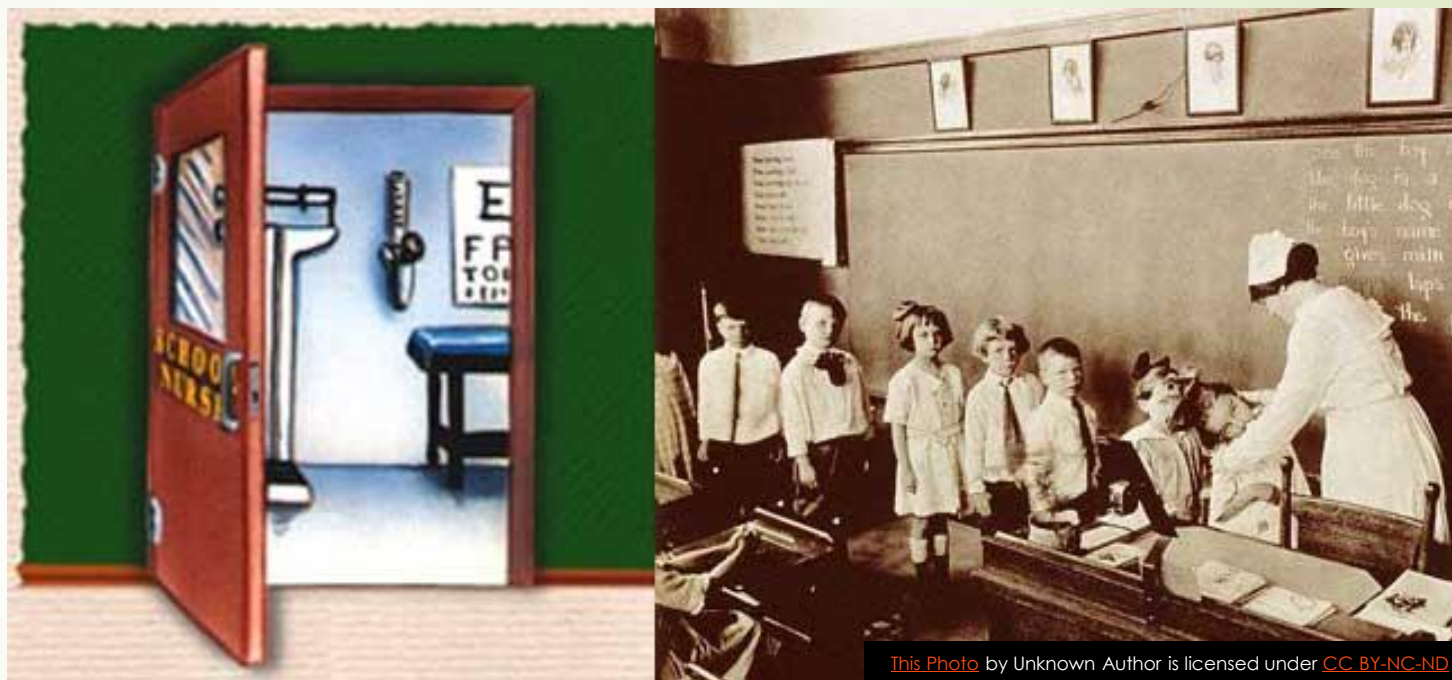
Enhancing Care Coordination for All Students with Type I Diabetes in Washington State

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- **What:** Group discussion on how care coordination works with families of children with Type 1 diabetes
 - **Why:** Type 1 diabetes (T1D) is one medically complex chronic condition that requires care coordination between the school nurse, family, and provider but we don't have a clear idea of how it happens in schools. We would like to talk with you to get a better understanding of the critical points of information exchange between the school nurse, parent and provider as well as the successes and challenges around keeping children safe at school.

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- **Who:** We are looking for
 - school nurses who take care of children (ages 6 – 12) with T1D
 - parents of children ages 6 – 12 with T1D
 - the nurse clinicians who take care of them.
 - **What it entails:** Participating in a 2-hour group discussion and providing feedback on the summary of the discussion. Participants will be given a \$75 gift card after completion of the focus group.
 - **When:** We will schedule a focus group when we have at least 2 school nurses, parents and nurse clinicians who say that they would like to participate.
 - **Where:** We will hold the group discussion at a location that is convenient for the majority of the participants. 1 group discussion in each ESD.
