- 1. Overcome health-related problems that inhibit their ability to succeed in school or in other educational programs.
- 2. Identify regional resources and services designed to support the health and educational needs of OSY and Migrant school aged students.
- 3. Address the specific health needs that affect a child's ability to participate effectively in those learning activities.
- 4. Gain access to academic services that support the completion of a high school diploma (or equivalent) and/or post-secondary educational services.

The NCESD is dedicated to supporting schools and communities in providing quality services for migrant students and their families. Our Migrant Consultants are available to provide in-district support in program planning and review, which includes in-depth data analysis based on student achievement. In addition, the Migrant Department provides a yearlong calendar of professional development opportunities that support staff in staying current on Migrant State requirements as well as academic strategies and techniques that supports the emotional academic growth of Migrant students.
